# **Expert Vocabulary**

<u>Religion</u>: Believing and worshipping a superhuman power e.g. God or gods

Superhuman: A being that is more powerful than a human that can do things a human cannot do Census - An official count of a group of people that happens every 10 years

<u>Local area -</u> The area near to where we live e.g. Leeds/ Bradford

<u>Worldview -</u> How a person thinks and sees the world <u>Organised worldview:</u> how an organised group sees the world e.g. Church of England

Personal worldview: How an individual sees the world

Theist: someone who believes in God

<u>Atheist:</u> a worldview that involves not believing in God <u>Agnostic:</u> a worldview that involves being unsure about the possible existence of God

#### What is a worldview?

The way a person sees the world according to their own situation and experiences is called a worldview. Worldviews can be influenced by many factors e.g.

- Religion
- Friends
- Family
- Social meeting
- Geographical area
- Historical time we live in

### What makes a religion?

Ninian Smart said there are 7 dimensions or factors that make a religion

- 1. Ritual the actions people do e.g. prayer
- 2. Narrative the stories people tell e.g. the nativity
- 3. Doctrinal the teachings/ holy books e.g. the Qur'an
- 4. Ethics the rules e.g. the 10 commandments
- 5. Social how do people group together e.g. Sunni and Shi'a Muslims
- 6. Material objects that people use e.g. prayer beads, statues, menorah

#### How do we know there is religion in the local area?

- Buildings e.g. churches/mosque
  - Festivals celebrated
- Shops e.g. halal / kosher butchers
- Dress e.g. turban (Sikh), hijab (Muslim)

We can look at the census for information. The 2021 census tells us that Christianity is the largest religion in Bradford and that Islam is the second largest. There has been an increase in people who have non-religious views

Nationally and Globally Christianity is the biggest of the world faiths however the number of non-religious worldviews nationally is growing

### Different types of worldview

<u>Theistic</u> - believes that God exists. Looks at evidence from holy books, creation of the world, idea suffering is a test

<u>Secular</u> - a worldview that is not based on religious ideas looks at scientific ideas e.g. Big Bang for creation, idea that evil and suffering means God cannot exist

# How do worldviews influence actions?

People's actions are influenced by what they believe and the experiences they have

E.g. Malala saw that the Taliban was restricting the right for education for girls and so campaigned for it.

Marcus Rashford grew up in poverty so campaigned for free school meals
